It's hard to believe, Friends with Dignity have been going strong now since 2015. It has been a whirlwind to say the least!

Having stepped away from my previous NFP after 3 years and evolved into an organisation that is collaborative and sustainable is something I could never have imagined. But I do not stand alone. Without a strong team and support this would not be possible.

I am supported by an amazing Board of Directors and the most committed and passionate Leadership Team who are all volunteers. These individuals not only assist me in the planning but are integral in the implementation and sustainability of the programs and services we offer to all agencies and frontline services.

In the last 8 years I have met the most amazing people I am so proud to work with and equally humbled to call my Friends. I have grown both professionally and personally. Understanding the essence of what a volunteer is and what makes them choose to work with you is something I am grateful for everyday and never take for granted.

Before going forward, I would like to offer you a recap of the last 8 years and where it all began.

I am married, a mother of 3 and granny to 1. My passion for helping people was deeply entrenched by my family who always had an "open door" policy. No one should ever go without or be alone! There was always enough food on the table but most of all love.

I was taught and shown that we have two hands, one for receiving and the other for giving so it was something I have always practiced and hopefully passed onto my next generation.

I was born in Mozambique and grew up in South Africa. Immigrated to Australia in 2010 and now living life on the Gold Coast. I have been a registered nurse for over 27 years where my passion to help people made going to work something I always looked forward to.

Starting my charity work in 2012, after being exposed to the prevalence and complexity of domestic and family violence it was evident that everyone has the capacity to make a difference. By engaging my neighbours, friends and extending this through the community, I was not only raising awareness of this insidious crime invading our space but reducing landfill and engaging people in a practical and tangible way. Creating a movement in assisting others facing the financial burden and after-effects of domestic and family violence takes a collective approach. I am constantly inspired and in awe of people's resilience and how the generosity of one can be so life changing for another.

Having only recently resigned from Queensland Health and now fulltime employed in the Charity, I have the time and focus to facilitate the growth and the ongoing demand of assistance and support to all adults and children impacted by Domestic and Family violence as we extend our services and programs Nationally.

# No one should ever go without or be alone!

Since 2015, having been mainly focused on the Gold Coast, Friends with Dignity now support services and frontline agencies across SE Qld, NSW, WA and most recently Victoria.

We have furnished over 1000 homes through our Sanctuary and Urgent Request programs.

Over 15,000 people assisted and supported and over 800 children awarded financial scholarships for educational and extra-curricular activities.

We have experienced a 46% increase in demand year on year which is reflective of the hardships people are facing everyday as a result of Domestic Violence. It is evident that the financial crisis has extended further not only to people facing adversity but to almost every household having to manage inflation, rise in the cost of living expenses and the constant interest hikes. Our everyday donations have reduced substantially, and we don't only understand this but can absolutely relate and appreciate the challenges we are all facing.

In 2021, Friends with Dignity was fortunate to be able to offer employment and we welcomed our first employee Friend, Tracey Wickham who stepped into the National Community Engagements and Fundraising manager. Focusing on engaging corporates and building relationships and securing partners has been a highlight for us all. We are so grateful to our Corporate Partners who have helped us sustain and continue our support to those who need us most.

As we move into 2024, I am confident we are well equipped to continue delivering our supportive

programs. My commitment to ongoing review, assessment and strategic planning will ensure the sustainability and growth of the organisation making a difference not only to me personally but to all our volunteers, donors, friends and family but most of all to the individuals and families we assist.

We have furnished over 1000 homes through our Sanctuary and Urgent Request programs.

I remain hopeful that one day my position becomes redundant and that domestic and family violence forms part of our history, however until then, I and the Friends with Dignity Team will continue to Step Up, Speak Out and Support all those impacted by domestic and family violence.

Thank you for your trust and faith in all we do here in Friends with Dignity and I take this opportunity to wish you all a safe and happy festive season.

Fully furnishing 'sanctuaries' for Domestic Violence survivors using preloved household items sourced from the community.




Our volunteers work so hard to pack and sort these donations annually making sure that our services have gifts for the families for Christmas and the start of the school year.

## Fundraising

At Friends with Dignity there are many ways that we fundraise to help fund our work.

Over this past year this has included our own events such as our High Tea with Friends events in Newcastle and Perth, our Brisbane and Gold Coast balls. We also held a Little Friends Giving Day to support our Little Friends Scholarship Program.

We got creative too and hosted Sip and Shine sessions supported by The Chroma Club in Miami. Start new sentence after Miami. Painting donated lampshades that are then placed in the homes we furnish through our Sanctuary program.

## Independent Fundraisers

Our organisation receives no government funding, so relies on donations, corporate sponsorship and fundraising to fund our many programs.


































#### Sanctuaries

Working with the community, we source pre-loved and new household items to fully furnish homes (Sanctuaries) within 7 days for Survivors of Domestic and Family Violence enabling them to move forward with purpose, dignity and hope.



## **Urgent requests**

Providing essential items on a time critical basis (less than 48 hours) to survivors and refuge centres which may include household items and crisis packs of personal care items.



## Friendsafe program

Provides monitored personal safety devices to individuals or families affected by Domestic and Family violence throughout Australia to be used in conjunction with their Safety Management Plan.



### Little friends

Aims to ensure that child survivors are not disadvantaged in the transition to a safe environment by supplying items designed to provide comfort and educational support.



## Little friends scholarships

We provide bi-annual monetary scholarships to children who have faced Domestic and Family Violence throughout Australia. These scholarships give these children the ability to either further their education and/or participate in extra-curricula activities that they may not be able to pursue due to the financial impact of Domestic and Family Violence within their family environment.



### Community engagements

We work to encourage individuals, groups and organisations to Step Up and become part of the solution, Speak Out against domestic violence and assist in providing Support to survivors.

## The Sanctuary Program

Our Sanctuary Program transforms houses into homes for people who have escaped domestic violence to start their new journey with dignity, free from abuse.

## Transforming Houses into Homes

Our dedicated volunteers work hard to create a Friends with Dignity Sanctuary using items donated by our supporters—household and personal care items, gift cards and financial donations.

We work on a referral basis only through registered referring agencies who contact us with a request.

The referring agency tells us a little bit about the family-how many people will be living in the home, how old they are, if there are any special requests which then helps Friends with Dignity personalise their sanctuary.

## Little Friends Scholarships

The Friends with Dignity Little Friends Scholarship program provides bi-annual monetary scholarships to children who have faced Domestic and Family Violence. Our scholarship program has been established to ensure that all children have the ability to either further their education and/or be able to participate in extra-curricular activities that they may not be able to pursue due to the financial impact of Domestic and Family violence within their family environment.

Through our scholarship, Friends with Dignity have assisted children by paying school fees, funding the purchase of laptops and tablets, funding swimming lessons, equine therapy for children with mental health issues and PTSD, enabling children to go on school camps with their peers, buying new uniforms for children who have changed school yet again in an effort to flee their perpetrator, enabling kids to pursue their passion in music, dance, drama and sport.





2023 saw Friends with Dignity start the year with our sixth year of our Little Friends scholarship program. Back to school expenses immediately following Christmas makes it a very difficult time for many families in our community. The ability to provide all that is required for children to start at or return school with everything they need for their new year, or the ability participate in extra-curricular activities can be out of the reach for many families and these children feel this isolation and insecurity. New uniforms for ever growing children, school fees, book lists, laptops, school camps, swimming lessons and sporting and music tuition fees topped the list of expenses each year for the 113 applications we received.

## My Personal Safety Device

Using revolutionary technology to aid domestic violence survivors, a Personal Safety Device looks and acts like any other smart watch, with the important additional feature: the ability to connect with emergency services any time of the day or night 365 days a year, with the push of a button, eliminating the need for a phone.

The FriendSafe program is an initiative established to ensure everyone is able to practice a basic need of feeling safe and access to an immediate response when feeling threatened or at risk.

Complementing the Friends with Dignity Urgent Request program, the FriendSafe initiative will provide an extra level of security to help those who have fled a violent situation, as well as those who may still be at risk, by providing them with a Personal Safety Device. We can provide a fully funded 12-month program providing a Personal Safety Device PLUS a 12 months of associated 24/7 monitoring for those who are referred by a registered agency, service or organisation, with the device to be used in conjunction with their Safety management Plan

## Our Finances

## Charity reporting 22/23

It was a remarkable year in which Friends with Dignity saw an increase in both Income, as well as Service provision expenses. This means due to additional funding received, Friends with Dignity was able to help more Victims of Domestic Violence.

Service provision expenses increased by 46% year on year. As can be seen from above result, donations are, within a quick turnaround time, reaching those whom desperately need our help.

As a Not-For-Profit, we most certainly felt the increase in costs given inflationary pressures. That said, through strict budgeting, planning and monthly reviewing thereof, we were able to not only adapt, but to grow. As a result, Friends with Dignity marginally increased it's contingency reserves.

Given how fluid the current environment is, having a financial buffer to weather the storm, will mean

our NFP can continue the work that we do through our volunteers, on a sustainable basis. Further to this, we noted an increase in both Corporate, as well as in Charitable Foundation support to our NFP. We believe this is an acknowledgement of our commitent, and our professionalism.

Friends with Dignity is registered with the Australian Charities and Not-For-Profits Commission (ACNC), a copy of our Annual Financial Statements can be found on their portal for those seeking more information. Friends with Dignity is Independently Audited every year, and endorsed with Deductible Gift Recipient status (DGRI) from the ATO.
